Results of Our Member Survey Are In

In May of 2010, we sent out a brief survey to solicit feedback from our members. There were 75 responses to the survey which addressed meeting topics, times, locations, speakers, those interested in volunteering and those interested in hosting. The highest percentage (59.4%) prefer to hold lunch meetings (21.7%-dinner, 13%-breakfast, 5.9% other). We received many good suggestions for meeting

topics including: Physical security, security technology, IT security, fire safety, tours, budgeting in the current economy, leadership, investigations, certification, emergency management, current events and risk assessments. A few speakers were recommended, however specific names mentioned have been past presenters at meetings. We strive to keep the topics and speakers fresh. Over

90% of the responses were satisfied with the current meeting location (PSEEG, South Plainfield) and a few have offered to host a meeting including Dow Jones and the Sarnoff Corporation.
